



The Minister Writes



“For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven”
Ecclesiastes 3:1

When you read this it will be a year since my welcome service on Saturday 3rd September 2011 at 6pm. It seems strange to think that it is only one year ago we were welcomed into the United Area. Moving to a new place can be strange and sometimes frightening. There will be some young people in our congregations who will be starting a new school or moving on to a different stage this September. But, hopefully, by this time next year, they will feel comfortable in their new surroundings. Steve and I are both grateful for the warm welcome we

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have both received, in contrast to the often cold and wet weather! This year has meant challenges for us as we adapt to a new role in a Christian Community, and as I learn about the rules and expectations of a new job. Yet the writer of Ecclesiastes reminds us that there is a time for everything. There is a time for new beginnings: these have included starting Messy Church at Millom and Kirkby becoming part of the Furness Faith Trail, ‘Land, Sea and Spirit’. It seems to me that this reading calls us to keep moving and that the world never stays the same. There is a time for everything - not that everything stays the same, but that some things run their course, such as my studying at University in preparation for ministry. So this year, my two years as a Probationer Minister will come to an end (hopefully!) at an Ordination Service in London at the end of June 2013. This means a shift from a life of continued study alongside ministry to ministry which includes study as part of

the daily routine. It will again be a time of change for us, as there will be different expectations to think about. Yet one thing is certain: that God continues alongside us, even as seasons change and some things come to an end. May you all know God walking with you as you seek to follow him.

Churches Together In Cumbria Emergency Response Team:

A Message to all Churches.

Cumbria has three teams who are the first line of response in the event of an emergency anywhere in the county. These teams are now getting very low on staff especially in the south of the county. We need to ensure that there are at least 8 or 10 people on each team. The teams do not have to be made up solely from the clergy as there could be within the congregations people who have had experience with the Emergency Services or armed forces in the past who would understand the nature of this sort of response. Please treat this as a matter of urgency - we have not had a major incident for a while but we know anything can happen at any time. Churches Together in Cumbria need to be able to respond in a positive and committed way as we have in the past. Then we welcomed our day visitors and set off for Birkrigg Common, David leading us on the short route as he had been sternly warned not to take us by the long and winding road embarked upon last year! (so much for the ability to travel far...) Once at the top, our own Olympic event began - the decathlon! Not as some may know from the real thing, but believe me, the ability to throw a paper plate into a gusting headwind was sadly lacking in our team! After a pause for lunch and some kite flying, we headed back to camp to complete the last three events (we opted for the Heptathlon in the end!!)
