

been agreed by our Trustees has been sent to all Church treasurers and I ask you all to consider the challenges it brings.

As I have undertaken this difficult task I am reminded of all those who have gone before me - some known to me and some unknown - and I also think of the early Christian Church and their attitude to giving. In Paul's 2<sup>nd</sup> letter to the Corinthians, he commends the Church for their generous giving and also points to the generosity of the Macedonian Churches. He says 'Their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. They gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability'. In chapter 9 Paul states 'each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver'.

In our Church today we are reluctant to cover the topic of our giving. We are embarrassed to mention it - fearing we will be seen as money grabbing or greedy.

This time of year can be quite a difficult time for a United Area treasurer. It is the time we look at our budget for the following financial year. Every year this becomes increasingly difficult with costs increasing and membership decreasing. Every year, as Trustees, we face the decision of how to divide the running costs of our United Area amongst the Churches which make up our Area. We have to examine our reserves and consider how they can best be used to further the work of God in South West Cumbria. As our membership decreases, the cost per member increases. The budget which has

We do not want to put pressure on those who are struggling and who already give in a sacrificial manner. However, having spent much time in the last few weeks examining our financial situation, I strongly believe that we all need to examine our giving. We are not asking anyone to give more than they can but are asking each one of you to prayerfully consider how much you can give to support your Church.

One of the five practices of fruitful congregations we have been looking at over the past couple of years is that of 'extravagant generosity'. This is not purely about money. It is about our attitude to giving - both of money and our time. It is important for us to consider what we want our United Area to be doing and whether we are enabling this through our own giving. I would hate for our ministry and mission to be hampered by lack of funds and lack of 'personnel' and fear this is a real risk.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our individual Church treasurers. I truly believe that I have been called by God to serve him in this practical way. In our Churches we see a real shortage of people coming forward who are prepared to undertake this vital role. If you feel that God is leading you in this direction, I would be happy to give any support needed. Again, I ask you to prayerfully consider if this is a way you could serve your Church.

I thank God that he still has a plan for his Church and that he continues to use us just as he used those first Churches in Macedonia and Corinth. I pray that, in the same way, we may be seen as people who give as much as we are able both financially and of our time, that we may serve our communities and further the work of God's kingdom here in South West Cumbria.



## **Youth spot**


